

**MINUTES OF THE U3A GENERAL MEETING  
HELD ON 11th APRIL 2013  
AT THE SOL IFACH HOTEL, CALPE**

John Pickford opened the meeting by relating the sad news of the death of Peter Kennard who died on Good Friday and he extended our sympathy to his widow Gillian and her family. Jenny O'Neill read out a card from Gillian thanking everyone for their kindness and stated that a collection of €224 had been given to Help of Calpe.

Rosemary was presented with a potted plant and Mike a bottle of wine after votes of thanks from Tina Wallis and Dell Haynes.
