**MINUTES OF THE OCTOBER GENERAL MEETING:**

The minutes had been put on the website and circulated. They were proposed by Mike Warnes, seconded by Keith Cherry and signed by the President John Pickford.

**MATTERS ARISING SINCE THE LAST MEETING:**

- Newsletter: The President confirmed with the members present that all had received their Newsletters by email or picked up their copy here today.
- Kutxabank Refunds: The bank has now paid fees into the U3A account and Edith is contacting the relevant members to enable them to receive their refunds. The bank has extended its offer for a further 12 months, so, just to clarify, if you pay your membership fee directly into the bank and at the same time open a current and savings account, they will refund the cost of the U3A membership.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

- Keith Wildman, President of AFPO said a few words mainly centered around the elections. He stated that probably we are all bored of elections which are taking place both in the UK and here in Spain but they should be of interest to us. Over the past 20 years Keith has been involved with 5 different mayors in Calpe and to date the current Mayor, Cesar Sanchez, has been the most budget conscious which is one of the most important things we need. We also have Carole Saunders who chairs the Committee concerned with charitable organisations which for us here as we get older is the only help we get as there is no state-funded social care. The new party Podemos is very left wing and anti-austerity and this could affect the euro which will in turn affect our money. Keith suggested that people should join AFPO as among other things it has the inside track for interaction with the town hall, and has the benefit of a webpage to keep us up to date.
- The new committee is now in place and was introduced to members. After the meeting our photographer took a photo to put on the website and in the scrapbook.
- The committee has been concerned about the number of late payments of subs which amount to a considerable amount of money. We have been taking steps to correct this by reminding members when their subs are due and by checking memberships on entry to our meetings. It is easy for

members just to forget for whatever reason but it is clearly not fair on the vast majority of people who do pay on time to be carrying late payers. Therefore we wish to tighten our policy on payment of subs. The following will be put into our policy book subject to approval:

- It is a requirement that membership fees are renewed on time but a period of 30 days leeway which covers illness, holidays or any other good reason will be accepted.
- Membership will be deemed to have lapsed after this 30 day period and the member will have to re-join in they wish to continue belonging to Calpe U3A. Only paid-up members will be allowed to take part in U3A group activities or social events and trips without paying a 'guest' surcharge where this applies.

Members were asked if there were any objections to this amendment and there were none so this is now policy. (This enhances the alteration in policy made on 9th May 2013).
