U3A General Account

Treasurer's Summary Report for financial year 2019/2020 (ending 31 Oct. 2020)

The final balance this year is €4959.01

This is €1319.41 up last year's final balance of €3639.60. Rather a marked increase but one largely due to the current coronavirus situation. New member and renewal subscriptions are somewhat reduced, most likely due to the enforced restrictions. However, the same restrictions have caused many U3A activities to be suspended for some considerable time, thus our expenditure has also been reduced (drastically). So, overall, we have an increase of €1319.41 albeit, perhaps, for the wrong reasons! Our financial position is usually relatively stable in the €3000 - €4000 range but currently in the €4500 - €5500 range.

Income: down €2538.88 to €4400.00.

Member subscriptions (our main source of income) are down by €2538.00. Perhaps not surprising, given the coronavirus restrictions as mentioned above. We appreciate these have made it difficult for many members to pay their subscriptions on time.

Expenses:

Photocopying & Printing costs down €12.50, to zero.

Your Committee has been successful in reducing this expense to zero, after making drastic savings in this area last year. This trend is expected to continue.

Stationery costs up €80.64 to € 287.36.

Slightly disappointing, but this is not considered a significant increase. However, the Committee shall endeavour to make economies, where possible, in this area.

Website costs down €810.60, to €233.53.

Again, this is another area where your Committee has been successful in making economies. We now have our own Webmaster and this has drastically reduced our Website hosting costs.

Room Hire down €960.00, to €240.00.

Until recently, we have been holding our meeting at the Hotel Ifach. However, due to the coronavirus situation, this Hotel is currently unable to offer meeting facilities. Hence we are meeting today in the Salon Blau, Casa de Cultura.

Your Committee cannot take credit for the significant saving made in this area. Once again, this is actually down to the coronavirus situation that has meant we have had far fewer meetings this year, thus saving the €120 Hotel Ifach charge per meeting.

The Salon Blau is currently free of charge. Therefore, should this venue prove popular with members, we may very likely continue to use it indefinitely for our meetings.

Social Expenses down €361.94, to €804.15.

As U3A social activities have been so reduced during the last year, it is hardly surprising to see a considerable saving in this area.

Misc. expenses up €35.05, to €735.34.

Although a very small increase, this is a slightly disappointing result. A modest decrease had been hoped for. However, your Committee shall continue to seek economies in this area.

Outlook for 2020/21:

With a membership of nearly 800, we have potential yearly income of between €7000 and €8000. This is adequate to comfortably meet anticipated expenses during the coming year. With much reduced social events, lesser meeting room and website hosting charges, the most significant of these likely to be the third party insurance premium due in 2021 (estimated €475). However, it is impossible to predict how any future changes in the coronavirus situation might influence our financial affairs. Of course, we all hope the situation will improve, restrictions lifted and things gradually return to normal though this, at present, is very uncertain.

Your Committee shall continue to look to make economies, wherever possible, without compromising member benefits in any way.
